Report

It is proposed that Monday 3rd June 2002 be declared a public holiday in order to mark the occasion of the Golden Jubilee of Her Majesty the Queen. It is further proposed that the public holiday scheduled for Monday 27th May 2002 be postponed until Tuesday 4th June 2002.

The appropriate legislation has been drafted and, in accordance with Standing Order 18A of the Standing Orders of the States of Jersey regarding manpower and financial implications, the Legislation Committee comments as follows -

- (a) there are no manpower implications other than the increased cost of overtime and premium payments applicable for working on a public holiday; and
- (b) the comments of the Finance and Economics Committee are to follow.

Explanatory Note

This Act provides for -

- (a) Monday 3rd June to be an additional public holiday in 2002; and
- (b) the public holiday scheduled for Monday 27th May 2002 to be postponed to Tuesday 4th June 2002.

THE STATES, in pursuance of Article 2 of the Public Holidays and Bank Holidays (Jersey) Law 1951, as amended,^[1] have made the following Act -

1. The third day of June 2002 shall be observed as a public holiday to mark the occasion of the Golden Jubilee of Her Majesty The Queen.

2. For the year 2002 the Schedule to the Public Holidays and Bank Holidays (Jersey) Act 1952, as amended,^[2] shall have effect as if for the item “the last Monday in May” there were substituted “the fourth day of June”.

3. This Act may be cited as the Public Holidays and Bank Holidays (No. 2) (Jersey) Act 200-.
