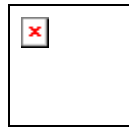


DRAFT HEALTH INSURANCE (MEDICAL BENEFIT) (AMENDMENT No. 55) (JERSEY) REGULATIONS 200

Report

The purpose of these Regulations is to increase the amount that can be claimed on the occasion of medical services provided by a general practitioner approved under the Health Insurance (Jersey) Law 1967 by recipients of Health Insurance Exception (HIE). With effect from 1st January 2002, the rates for all services will be increased by six per cent. Based on the usage of services in 2000, this increase is expected to cost an additional £60,000, 60 per cent of which is met by the Health Insurance Fund and 40 per cent from general revenues. However, the true cost, and therefore the whole cost of the Scheme, is dependent on the number of recipients and actual service usage and is expected to be met from within allocated cash limits. As at 31st October 2001, there are 3710 HIE recipients.

There are no manpower implications for the States arising from these draft Regulations.

Note: The Finance and Economics Committee supports the draft Regulations, subject to the increases being met from within the Employment and Social Security Committee's existing cash limit.

Explanatory Note

The purpose of these Regulations is to increase the amounts of medical benefit payable in respect of specified medical services provided on or after 1 January 2002 by approved medical practitioners to persons who are exempt from liability to pay contributions under the Health Insurance (Jersey) Law 1967. The increases approximate 6 per cent.

THE STATES, in pursuance of Articles 18 and 46 of the Health Insurance (Jersey) Law 1967,^[1] as amended,^[2] have made the following Regulations -

1.-(1) For the Schedule to the Health Insurance (Medical Benefit) (Jersey) Regulations 1967, as amended,^[3] there shall be substituted the Schedule set out in the Schedule to these Regulations.

(2) The rates of benefit prescribed in the Schedule set out in the Schedule to these Regulations shall apply in relation to medical services provided by an approved medical practitioner on or after 1st January 2002.

2. The Health Insurance (Medical Benefit) (Amendment No. 53) (Jersey) Regulations 2001^[4] are repealed.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Health Insurance (Medical Benefit) (Amendment No. 55) (Jersey) Regulations 200- and shall come into force on the first day of January 2002.

A. Rates of benefit in respect of medical services generally

(1) For medical services provided at the approved medical practitioner’s surgery	15.95
(2) For medical services provided elsewhere than at the approved medical practitioner’s surgery, between the hours of eight o’clock in the morning and six o’clock in the evening, on any day other than a Sunday or public holiday	26.45
(3) For medical services provided elsewhere than at the approved medical practitioner’s surgery on a Sunday or public holiday, or between the hours of six o’clock in the evening and eight o’clock in the morning of any day	47.05
(4) For medical services provided as specified in item (2) or item (3) above for any person, other than the first insured person, who received the service on the same premises, and during the same visit, as the first insured person	15.95

B. Additional rates of benefit in respect of particular medical services

(1) Injection (where drug supplied by medical practitioner and syringe of disposable type used)	6.25
(2) Blood test	6.25
(3) Insertion of vaginal ring pessary (where appliance supplied by medical practitioner)	6.85
(4) Stitching of minor wound, etc.	6.25
(5) Minor operations (where no, or only local, anaesthetic is used and including the cost of stitching but excluding the cost of any anaesthetic used)	22.00
(6) Electrocardiogram	29.90
(7) Ear syringing	6.25
(8) Pregnancy urine test	13.90
(9) Letter from a medical practitioner to a consultant or specialist at the General Hospital referring a patient for examination	6.25
(10) Cervical smear	6.85
(11) Cryo-surgery	6.25 ”.
