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large development on such a small site, where once there had been a pleasant bungalow, as one of most of the properties in the area - admittedly some do have dormer windows.

Had we been here at the beginning of the planning process we would certainly objected to the proposals on several grounds, namely the height of the houses, effectively three storeys (including dormer windows in the roof), the cramped position, the proximity to the very narrow road and the obstruction of views. Our lounge which had a distant sea view now looks out onto eaves and roofs.

When we later learned that the developers had submitted incorrect information to the planning committee it seemed impossible to believe that permission was granted. Did no one bother to check the facts? It would appear not.
