R&O.15/2021.

Covid-19 (Workplace Restrictions) (Amendment No. 9) (Jersey) Order 2021.

Minister for Health and Social Services.

This Order amends the Covid-19 (Workplace Restrictions) (Jersey) Order 2020 (*Article 1* is the interpretation provision referring to that Order) to relax some of the restrictions on the opening of workplaces (and to tighten them in one small respect).

Article 2 amends Article 2 (the provision of the 2020 Order requiring the closure to the public of certain workplaces). The amendments:

- (a) allow the opening of workplaces used for the purposes of carrying out:
 - (i) activities undertaken by spas, nail salons, beauty salons, waxing salons or tanning salons, or for laser hair removal,
 - (ii) non-surgical cosmetic procedures such as Botox injections and facial fillers,
 - (iii) tattooing, piercing, acupuncture or massage, or
 - (iv) providing haircuts, hair styling or the professional application of make-up;
- (b) require changing and shower facilities used in connection with indoor or outdoor sport or exercise to be closed whether those facilities are indoors or outdoors; and
- (c) remove the requirement for swimming and paddling pools to be closed in all circumstances (they are now allowed to be open for limited purposes described below).

Article 3 amends Article 3 (the provision of the 2020 Order allowing specified workplaces to be open to the public for certain purposes). It is widened to allow:

- (a) changing facilities used in connection with swimming pools or paddling pools to be open but only for the purpose of certain children's activities;
- (b) swimming pools and paddling pools to be open but only for the same purposes as indoor physical activity facilities are allowed to be open;
- (c) licensed premises to be open additionally for the purposes mentioned in (a)(i) to (iv) as to *Article 2*; and
- (d) indoor physical activity facilities to be open additionally to allow up to 5 high performing athletes to take part in a physical activity along with up to 2 trainers or others instructing the athletes or assisting them with their training or physical fitness.

Article 4 limits the requirement to wear masks in indoor physical activity facilities to where they are required to be worn by visitors, namely when access is incidental to the use of outdoor facilities or in connection with therapeutic services.

Article 5 provides for how the Order is to be cited and for it to come into force on 10th February 2021.

The Order was made on 9th February 2021 and came into force on 10th February 2021.

R&O.17/2021.

Road Traffic (Public Parking Places – Charges) (Amendment No. 5) (Jersey) Order 2021.

Minister for Infrastructure.

This Order increases parking charges in public parking places by a maximum of 1.15%. The parking unit charge is increased except for electric and plug in hybrid electric vehicles. The charges for monthly season tickets are increased, including for electric and plug in hybrid electric vehicles. Excess charges remain



unchanged and parking remains free for electric or plug in hybrid electric vehicles for a period of 12 months after first registration in Jersey.

This Order removes the definition “low emission vehicle” as this is no longer considered necessary in the light of the specific provisions for electric and plug in hybrid vehicles.

Parking charges were last increased with effect from 1st March 2020. This Order comes into force on 1st March 2021.

The Order was made on 12th February 2021 and came into force on 1st March 2021.

R&O.18/2021.

Road Traffic (St. Mary) (Amendment No. 3) (Jersey) Order 2021.

Minister for Infrastructure.

This Order amends the Road Traffic (St. Mary) (Jersey) Order 2000 by allowing pedal cycles to be used in both directions along the part of La Rue de la Vallée which is one-way for other vehicles.

This Order comes into force 7 days after the day it is made.

The Order was made on 12th February 2021 and came into force on 19th February 2021.

R&O.19/2021.

Social Security (Contributions) (Covid-19) (Amendment No. 2) (Jersey) Order 2021.

Minister for Social Security.

This Order amends Articles 2 and 3 of the Social Security (Contributions) (Covid-19) (Jersey) Order 2020 (the “principal Order”) to provide that an employer required to make a Class 1 contribution in respect of the period of 3 months beginning 1st October 2020 (“Quarter D”), or an insured person required to pay a Class 2 contribution in respect of Quarter D, may apply to defer payment of those contributions by up to 24 months. The Order comes into force on the day after it is made.

The Order was made on 7th January 2021 and came into force on 8th January 2021.

R&O.20/2021.

Covid-19 (Gathering Control) (Amendment No. 2) (Jersey) Order 2021.

Minister for Health and Social Services.

This Order amends the current limitations on people gathering that are set out in the Covid-19 (Gathering Control) (Jersey) Order 2020 (see *Article 1*).

The effect is to increase the numbers of people who may gather for the celebration of a marriage or civil partnership, at a funeral or part of a service of religious worship from 20 to 40 (*Article 2*). The Order also allows up to 35 people to gather to enable children to participate in sport or exercise (*Article 3*).

The Order comes into force on 17th February 2021 (*Article 4*).

The Order was made on 15th February 2021 and came into force on 17th February 2021.

**R&O.21/2021.**

Covid-19 (Gathering Control) (Amendment No. 3) (Jersey) Order 2021.

Minister for Health and Social Services.

This Order amends the Covid-19 (Gathering Control) (Jersey) Order 2020, following the amendment to that Order made by the Covid-19 (Gathering Control) (Amendment No. 2) (Jersey) Order 2021 (the “Amendment No. 2 Order”). The effect of this amendment is to require a gathering to be in the open air if it is to benefit from the exception for controlled gatherings of up to 35 people for children’s sport or exercise, which was added by the Amendment No. 2 Order.

This Order comes into force immediately after the commencement of the Amendment No. 2 Order, at the start of 17th February 2021.

The Order was made on 16th February 2021 and came into force on 17th February 2021.

R&O.22/2021.

Education (Grants and Allowances) (Amendment) (Jersey) Order 2021.

Minister for Education.

The Education (Grants and Allowances) (Amendment) (Jersey) Order 2021 makes amendments to certain definitions in the interpretation provision of the Education (Grants and Allowances) (Jersey) Order 2018 (the “2018 Order”). It also provides for a maximum available grant in respect of a distance learning course, for a maximum duration of a course for which a skills bursary is payable, and adds a further situation in which interview attendance allowance is not payable. In particular –

Article 1 states that the Order amends the 2018 Order.

Article 2 amends Article 1 (interpretation) of the 2018 Order to update the definition of “parent” and delete the definition “income” (which is re-inserted as its own Article in *Article 4*).

Article 3 amends Article 2 (dependent and independent students) of the 2018 Order by amending the definition of “independent student” by removing the requirement for a married student to also be over the age of 21; and adding that a student qualifies as an independent student if the student has no living parents, is themselves a parent, or is under the care of the Minister for Children and Housing or is a care leaver.

Article 4 inserts a new Article 3A (meaning of “income”) into the 2018 Order. This re-states the definition “income” that is deleted from Article 1 of the 2018 Order, and provides that, if an individual holds 5% or more interest in a business, income from that business is deemed to be the income of that individual, in proportion with the individual’s holding in the business.

Article 5 amends Article 17 (distance learning courses) of the 2018 Order to provide that a distance learning grant is subject to a maximum payment of £7,400 per academic year.

Article 6 amends Article 21 (skills bursary allowance) of the 2018 Order to provide that a skills bursary is available only for a course whose duration does not exceed 2 years.

Article 7 amends Article 22 (interview attendance allowance) of the 2018 Order to provide that interview attendance allowance is not payable where the “relevant assets” in respect of the student exceed £500,000.

Article 8 gives the citation and provides that the Order comes into force 7 days after it is made.

The Order was made on 19th February 2021 and came into force 26th February 2021.



R&O.23/2021.

Road Traffic (St. Saviour) (Amendment No. 14) (Jersey) Order 2021.

Minister for Infrastructure.

This Order amends the Road Traffic (St. Saviour) (Jersey) Order 2000 by replacing the current one-way restriction in La Chasse Brunet. That restriction allows traffic to be driven a northerly direction only from the junction with Bagatelle Road to the junction with La Rue de Patier. This Order provides for the one-way restriction to run in the opposite direction, that is, to allow vehicles to be driven only in the direction from the junction with La Rue de Patier to Bagatelle Road.

This Order comes into force on the day after the day it is made.

The Order was made on 19th February 2021 and came into force on 20th February 2021.

R&O.24/2021.

Covid-19 (Workplace Restrictions and Gathering Control) (Amendment No. 2) (Jersey) Order 2021.

Minister for Health and Social Services.

This Order further relaxes the restrictions imposed by the Covid-19 (Workplace Restrictions) (Jersey) Order 2020 and makes a minor amendment to the Covid-19 (Gathering Control) (Jersey) Order 2020.

Article 1 provides that *Articles 2 to 8* amend the above-mentioned Order on restrictions in workplaces.

Article 2 inserts into the interpretation Article a definition of “accommodation premises” to cover registered tourism premises (hotels, guest houses, self-catering accommodation, youth hostels and camp sites) and clubs where members can stay.

Article 3 removes the restriction on the opening of workplaces used by driving instructors (meaning their vehicles).

Article 4 lifts some of the restrictions on the opening of food and drink premises to allow food and drink to be served at tables of up to 10 people till 10 p.m., for premises to be open till 10.30 p.m. and for alcohol to be served if it is ordered at the same time as, or during the consumption of, a meal. In the case of food and drink premises that are also accommodation premises, the time limits do not apply in respect of residents and their guests. Nightclubs are now allowed to be open for the purpose of serving food and drink in accordance with these requirements. Other restrictions applying to licensed premises are removed. Nothing in the whole of this Article is to affect any other condition to which a licence is subject.

Article 5 limits the requirements for visitors to food and drink premises to wear masks to where the visitor is purchasing or waiting to purchase take-away food or is consuming food or drink on the premises, except while actually eating or drinking. In the case of accommodation premises the visitor must wear a mask in the non-food and drink part of the premises except in the visitor’s own sleeping accommodation. People are also required to wear masks in driving instructors’ vehicles.

Article 6 requires workers to wear masks or visors in accommodation premises, and in the case of food premises and accommodation premises, the requirement now applies also while the worker is in the presence of a person working as part of a different workforce to the worker. Driving instructors are also now required to wear masks unless to do so would be unsafe.

Article 7 extends the contact tracing requirements to accommodation premises and driving instructors’ vehicles.

Article 8 extends the 2 metre distancing requirements to food and drink premises where customers are purchasing or waiting to purchase take-away food or consuming food or drink on the premises. The exceptions are in respect of people who expected to sit at the same table or where the occupier or operator of the premises has deployed screens that shield people from each other. The distancing requirements are also extended to accommodation premises except in the person’s own sleeping accommodation.



Article 9 amends the Covid-19 (Gathering Control) (Jersey) Order 2020 to correct a cross-reference and make it clear that the relaxation on gatherings at weddings, funerals and religious services to up to 40 people applies only to the ceremony itself.

Article 10 provides the name by which the Order may be cited and for it to come into force on 22nd February 2021.

The Order was made on 19th February 2021 and came into force on 22nd February 2021.

R&O.25/2021.

Prison (Amendment No. 5) (Jersey) Rules 2021.

Minister for Home Affairs.

These Rules amend the Prison (Jersey) Rules 2007 to allow a unit manager to inquire into a disciplinary charge against a prisoner (currently, only senior unit managers and above can inquire into a charge). These Rules come into force 7 days after they are made.

The Rules were made on 23rd February 2021 and came into force on 2nd March 2021.

***R&O.26/2021.**

Covid-19 (Workplace – Twentieth Extension) (Jersey) Order 2021.

Minister for Health and Social Services.

This Order amends the Covid-19 (Workplace Restrictions) (Jersey) Order 2020, to extend the restriction period to end at the end of Wednesday 31st March 2021.

This Order comes into force on 1st March 2021.

The Order was made on 25th February 2021 and came into force on 1st March 2021.

***R&O.27/2021.**

Covid-19 (Gathering Control – Fourth Extension) (Jersey) Order 2021.

Minister for Health and Social Services.

This Order amends the Covid-19 (Gathering Control) (Jersey) Order 2020, to extend the gathering control period to end at the end of Wednesday 31st March 2021.

This Order comes into force on 1st March 2021.

The Order was made on 25th February 2021 and came into force on 1st March 2021.

***R&O.28/2021.**

Road Traffic (Periodic Technical Inspections – General Provisions) (Amendment) (Jersey) Order 2021.

Minister for Infrastructure.



This Order amends the Road Traffic (Periodic Technical Inspections – General Provisions) (Jersey) Order 2018 by postponing for 3 years, that is, from 30th March 2021 until 31st March 2024, the date from which vehicles other than minibuses, light motor cycles and mopeds must have their first periodic technical inspections. The scheme introducing mandatory periodic technical inspections for minibuses, light motor cycles and mopeds started on 30th March 2019. For all other vehicles, the date by which the first periodic technical inspection must be made is 5 years after first use and every subsequent 3 years but any such date is disregarded if it falls before 30th March 2021. This Order changes that date to 31st March 2024.

The Order also postpones for 3 years, that is from 30th March 2024, until 31st March 2027, the date by which the provisions in the Order phasing in the periodic technical inspection scheme cease to have effect.

This Order comes into force 7 days after the day it is made.

The Order was made on 26th February 2021 and comes into force on 5th March 2021.

“Will the Chief Minister provide the Assembly with a list of any completed reviews falling within either his remit or that of the Chief Executive that are as yet unpublished or that have not been actioned, including any reviews relating to States of Jersey employees and Government infrastructure?”

4. The Minister for Education tabled an answer on 15th February 2021 to the following question by Deputy R.J. Ward of St. Helier –

“Will the Minister provide an update on the following aspects of peak flow testing in schools –

- (a) the number of students tested daily in schools between 12th January and 5th February 2021;
- (b) this number expressed as a percentage of the school-age population; and
- (c) the number of tests that were self-administered by students?”

5. H.M. Attorney General tabled an answer on 22nd February 2021 to the following question by Senator S.Y. Mézec –

“Will H.M. Attorney General advise whether the provisions of the Powers of Attorney (Jersey) Law 1995 allow for an individual to attend and vote at a Parish Assembly on behalf of those who have signed over power of attorney to them on that basis; and if so, does this enable one person to vote multiple times on behalf of a number of Parishioners?”

6. The Minister for Social Security tabled an answer on 22nd February 2021 to the following question by Senator S.Y. Mézec –

“Will the Minister advise, on the basis of Jersey’s minimum wage increasing to the level of the Island’s living wage (i.e. £10.96 per hour) –

- (a) how many workers would receive a pay rise;



- (b) how many workers who are claiming Income Support would be raised above the threshold to claim such support; and
- (c) what amount, if any, would be saved from the Income Support budget?"

7. The Chief Minister tabled an answer on 22nd February 2021 to the following question from Deputy R.J. Ward of St. Helier –

“Will the Chief Minister outline the process for declaring and documenting conflicts of interest that arise during any decision-making process, both for Ministers and for employees; and will he advise the Assembly how many decisions, if any, have been taken where a conflict of interest has been identified, specify what any such decisions were, and describe the steps that were taken to mitigate any risks arising from such conflicts of interest?”

8. The Minister for Education tabled an answer on 22nd February 2021 to the following question from Deputy R.J. Ward of St. Helier –

“Will the Minister advise what work, if any, is currently being undertaken to evaluate the free school meals pilot; and will he outline the timescale for decision-making regarding the future of this scheme?”

9. The Minister for Infrastructure tabled an answer on 22nd February 2021 to the following question from Deputy R.J. Ward of St. Helier –

“Will the Minister advise what work, if any, has been undertaken to date to bring forward the changes outlined in ‘Green Lanes and quiet lanes: priority to pedestrians, cyclists and horse riders’ (P.79/2020), adopted as amended by the Comité des Connétables?”

10. The Assistant Minister for Treasury and Resources tabled an answer on 22nd February 2021 to the following question from Senator S.C. Ferguson –

“Further to reports of problems with the JT network and data connections, will the Assistant Minister advise whether JT has notified the Minister, as shareholder representative, of any such problems; and if so, will he state what explanation has been provided by JT for the cause of the problems, if known, and whether they are ongoing problems or new issues with the network?”

11. The Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture tabled an answer on 22nd February 2021 to the following question from Senator S.C. Ferguson –

“Given the importance of a reliable data supply to the delivery of improved productivity, will the Minister advise whether any problems with the reliability of the data supply and data sources within JT’s services have been communicated to his Department and, if so, whether the Department has been involved in any investigation of the problems and their impact on productivity; and, if problems have been reported, will he advise why States members have not been notified?”

12. The Minister for Education tabled an answer on 22nd February 2021 to the following question from Deputy C.S. Alves of St. Helier –

“Will the Minister state, in relation to the use of Lateral Flow Testing on students –

- (a) what percentage of students are being tested;
- (b) how often they are being tested;
- (c) how many tests have seen a positive result;



- (d) how many results have led to a subsequent P.C.R. test; and
- (e) of any such P.C.R. tests, how many have seen a positive result?”

13. The Minister for Health and Social Services tabled an answer on 22nd February 2021 to the following question from Deputy C.S. Alves of St. Helier –

“Will the Minister provide an update on the usage of the Jersey Covid Alert app, including –

- (a) how many devices currently have the app installed;
- (b) how many times the app has been installed and subsequently uninstalled; and
- (c) since the launch of the app, the number of people each month who have been contact-traced via the app?”

14. The Minister for Health and Social Services tabled an answer on 22nd February 2021 to the following question from Deputy C.S. Alves of St. Helier –

“Will the Minister provide, by sector, the figures for take-up of workforce testing?”

15. The Minister for Social Security tabled an answer on 22nd February 2021 to the following question from Deputy G.P. Southern of St. Helier –

“Further to the response to Written Question 9/2021, will the Minister –

- (a) explain why the response drew a comparison between the change in average weekly claims for Income Support and the prospective uprate in Income Support components on the basis of R.P.I.;
- (b) state the percentage rise in the components labelled as Basic Rates (i.e. removing the rental components) in order to indicate changes in disposable income compared with R.P.I.; and
- (c) state the percentage rise in the rental components over the period 2014 to 2021?”

16. The Minister for External Relations tabled an answer on 22nd February 2021 to the following question from Deputy G.P. Southern of St. Helier –

“Given the impact of Brexit on the U.K.’s access to European financial markets, will the Minister advise –

- (a) when, if at all, he expects to see significant progress on the U.K. gaining access through the ‘equivalence’ of regulations;
- (b) what part, if any, he will have in any equivalence negotiations; and
- (c) whether there has been any loss in business volumes in Jersey’s own finance sector in response to the lack of agreement between U.K. and the E.U. or any transfer of business to European countries?”



17. The Minister for the Environment tabled an answer on 22nd February 2021 to the following question from Deputy I. Gardiner of St. Helier –

“In relation to the Jersey Blue Badge Scheme, will the Minister advise –

- (a) whether his Department has produced a report into parking for the Scheme and, if so, why;
- (b) when any such report was initiated;
- (c) whether the Minister for Infrastructure was consulted prior to the instigation of any such report; and, if not, why not given that this Minister has responsibility for car parks and Parking Control; and
- (d) whether there is any intention to liaise with the Parking Control Office (which holds relevant information) in order to avoid any duplication?”

- (d) the number of applications that were renewals;
- (e) a breakdown of the total cost to the applicant of an application, to include the cost of the application fee and the cost of any documents that are required; and
- (f) a breakdown of the total administrative costs of a single application?”

19. The Minister for Health and Social Services tabled an answer on 22nd February 2021 to the following question from Deputy M.R. Higgins of St. Helier –

“Will the Minister advise members –

- (a) how the Hospital and Health service record the details of incidents involving injury to patients (whether in theatre, post-theatre, in wards, during transfer from one part of the hospital or health facilities to another or in post treatment or supportive services);
- (b) where any such records are kept, how patients can access them, and what restrictions on access to them, if any, there are;
- (c) what vetting or quality control, if any, is taken in compiling such reports to ensure their accuracy; and
- (d) what use is made of these records to ensure that lessons are learned?”

20. The Minister for Health and Social Services tabled an answer on 22nd February 2021 to the following question from Deputy M.R. Higgins of St. Helier –

“Will the Minister, in relation to incident reports generated in the Hospital and health service –

- (a) advise how many such reports have been generated each year since 2017 to the present date, in each department or category; and
- (b) detail the nature of the incidents reported in each of the years in paragraph (a), the frequency in which they occurred, and the lessons learned, and actions taken, in relation to them?”

- (a) the Judiciary (i.e. courts and tribunals);
- (b) the Law Officers’ Department;
- (c) the Police (both Honorary and States); and
- (d) any other organization or body that is funded from general funds, but that also has access to such special purpose funds?”

22. The Minister for Economic Development, Tourism, Sport and Culture tabled an answer on 1st March to the following question asked by Deputy L.B.E. Ash of St. Clement:

“Will the Minister advise why the football goals were removed from F.B. Fields and Le Rocquier School playing fields during the February half-term, and whether or not this is standard Departmental policy; and if this is standard practice, will he explain why?”

23. The Minister for Treasury and Resources tabled an answer on 1st March to the following question asked by Senator S.Y. Mézec:

“Will the Chief Minister state how many letters of instruction have been issued by Ministers since the 2018 election, with the information broken down by year, Minister, and the subject of the decision?”

26. The Chair of the Privileges and Procedures Committee tabled an answer on 1st March to the following question asked by Senator S.Y. Mézec:



“Will the Chair provide a list of every sitting States Member who has declared an interest as a private residential landlord during previous States debates, and (if available) the details of that interest in each case?”

27. The Minister for Treasury and Resources tabled an answer on 1st March to the following question asked by Deputy K.F. Morel of St Lawrence:

“In her role as Shareholder Representative, will the Minister provide an annual breakdown of the increases in electricity charges levied by Jersey Electricity for each year since 2015, providing also a comparison with R.P.I. Low Income for each year?”

28. The Minister for Treasury and Resources tabled an answer on 1st March to the following question asked by Deputy K.F. Morel of St Lawrence:

“Will the Minister, as Shareholder Representative, provide an annual breakdown of the increases in telecom charges levied by JT for each year since 2015, providing also a comparison with R.P.I. Low Income for each year?”

29. The Minister for Treasury and Resources tabled an answer on 1st March to the following question asked by Deputy K.F. Morel of St Lawrence:

“In her role as Shareholder Representative, will the Minister provide an annual breakdown of the increases in water charges levied by Jersey Water for each year since 2015, providing also a comparison with R.P.I. Low Income for each year?”

30. The Minister for the Environment tabled an answer on 1st March to the following question asked by Deputy R.J. Ward of St. Helier:

“Will the Minister provide details of the overall cost of subsidising the Home Energy Audit scheme since its inception?”

31. The Minister for Infrastructure tabled an answer on 1st March to the following question asked by Deputy R.J. Ward of St. Helier:

“Will the Minister advise what dialogue, if any, has been undertaken with the Island’s fuel companies and the outcome, if any, of any such dialogue, in relation to –

- (a) the provision of increased ethanol content fuel across the Jersey supply;
- (b) the availability of all alternatives to diesel and other hydrocarbon fuels; and
- (c) the provision of carbon offset systems for fuel users?”

32. The Minister for Education tabled an answer on 1st March to the following question asked by Deputy R.J. Ward of St. Helier:

“Will the Minister provide the following details in relation to the use of consultants to produce the education reform program for 2021 to 2023 –

- (a) the estimated total expenditure;
- (b) how planned expenditure is agreed and allocated; and



(c) what the process is for awarding contracts to consultants?”

33. The Assistant Chief Minister tabled an answer on 1st March to the following question asked by the Deputy of St. Mary:

“In relation to the new hospital project at Overdale, will the Minister advise whether any consideration has being given to the relocation of the Crematorium in order to incorporate that site into the area designated for the hospital; and, if so, have the following been part of any such consideration –

- (a) the reduction of the effect on (and the need to acquire) neighbouring properties;
- (b) the improvement of traffic flow in the area by eliminating that currently associated with the Crematorium;
- (c) the provision of a larger Crematorium (including parking facilities);
- (d) the appropriateness, arising from their respective functions, of having a Crematorium sited next to a hospital;

and, if consideration has not yet been given to the above, will he confirm that such consideration will now be given?”

Attorney General explain the concept of perceived, apparent and actual bias in relation to the activities of politicians, civil servants, the Law Officers’ Department and the Judiciary, highlighting any legal difference between these terms, and advise what legal, procedural or other remedies are available to individuals who believe they have been affected by any such bias?”



38. The Minister for Social Security tabled an answer on 1st March to the following question asked by Deputy M.R. Higgins of St. Helier:

“Will the Minister advise –

- (a) the total owed by Income Support recipients due to overpayments at the end of each accounting year from 2015 to date;
- (b) how this total can be broken down –
 - (i) by the actions of the recipient; and
 - (ii) by mistakes or other failures of the department;
- (c) whether these overpayments are classed as debt owing to the States or otherwise accounted;
- (d) how the department takes into account that all overpayments are not always the fault of the recipient but can be caused by mistakes or failures of the department in how it handles cases;
- (e) how does the department recover overpayments, to what extent does it consider ability to pay, and over what periods does the department recover these sums;

- (h) what the department’s policy is regarding writing off overpayments, and in what circumstances this applies; and
- (i) what the Ministers discretion is in dealing with overpayments and to what extent has she delegated this discretion?”

“Will the Minister advise members of –

- (a) the number of 2(1)(e) High Value Residents in the Island in each of the years 2015 to date, together with their estimated net worth in each of those years;
- (b) the total income tax received in Jersey from these residents for each year of the same period;
- (c) the estimated unearned income generated in the Island for these residents for the years 2015 to date;
- (d) the nationality of these residents (determined by passport or multiple passports); and
- (e) the number of 2(1)(e) residents with fixed or negotiable agreements with the Department, or with agreements that can be varied over time?

40. The Minister for Health and Social Services tabled an answer on 1st March to the following question asked by Deputy L.M.C Doublet of St. Saviour:

“Will the Minister explain what assessment was made of the risk factors in terms of exempting children under the age of 3, versus children under the age of 5, in the restrictions on gatherings?”



41. The Minister for Health and Social Services tabled an answer on 1st March to the following question asked by Deputy L.M.C Doublet of St. Saviour:

“Will the Minister state what assessments, if any, were made of the risk of exempting younger children from public health guidance in the home in comparison with public spaces, controlled events and gatherings such as playgroups?”

42. The Minister for Health and Social Services tabled an answer on 1st March to the following question asked by Deputy L.M.C Doublet of St. Saviour:

“Will the Minister explain what analysis, if any, was undertaken to assess how the needs and rights of younger children would be affected by the Covid-19 Winter Strategy and the Government’s subsequent exit strategies; and will he advise Members of where and how any such analysis has been documented?”

Discretion is exercised by the Presiding Officer in accordance with guidance issued by the Bailiff, following consultation with the Privileges and Procedures Committee. The current guidance was presented to the States in the report ‘Time Limits on Speeches in Debates: Guidance on the Exercise of Discretion’ (R.3/2021). The report states that discretion may be exercised to allow for a longer speech than 15 minutes where the member speaking is designated as the ‘main respondent’ to the debate.
