	Officer of Transport and Technical Services about possible approaches to a review of hazardous waste disposal. Members agreed that ash and asbestos disposal should be considered separately and the Scrutiny Officer was asked to amend the scoping document accordingly. Other minor amendments were noted and it was decided that subject to final confirmation with the Minister, ash disposal should be prioritized as the Panel's first review, with asbestos treatment to be looked at separately at a later date. 	It was agreed that the ash review would take some account of the possible impact of importing waste from Guernsey, although this could be looked at more closely as a standalone topic. The implications of continued development on the Waterfront would also be considered, as this could require further excavation of historic ash deposits.	мо
