Independent auditors' report to the committee of Jersey Council for Safety and Health at Work

We have audited the financial statements of Jersey Council for Safety and Health at Work for the year ended 31 December 2011 which comprise the income and expenditure account, the balance sheet and the related notes. These financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and on the basis of the accounting policies set out therein.

This report is made solely to the Council. Our audit work has been undertaken so that we might state to the Council those matters we are required to state to them in an auditors' report and for no other purpose. To the fullest extent permitted by law, we do not accept or assume responsibility to anyone other than the Council for our audit work, this report or for the opinions we have formed.

Respective responsibilities of the Council and the Auditors

The council members are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements in accordance with the applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards.

Our responsibility is to audit the financial statements in accordance with relevant legal and regulatory requirements and United Kingdom Auditing Standards.

We report to you our opinion as to whether the financial statements give a true and fair view. We also report to you if, in our opinion, the Annual Report is not consistent with the financial statements, if the Council has not kept proper accounting records, or if we have not received all the information and explanations we require for our audit.

Basis of audit opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with United Kingdom Auditing Standards issued by the Auditing Practices Board. An audit includes examination, on a test basis, of evidence relevant to the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. It also includes an assessment of the significant estimates and judgements made by the Council in the preparation of the financial statements, and of whether the accounting policies are appropriate to the Council's circumstances, consistently applied and adequately disclosed.

We planned and performed our audit so as to obtain all the information and explanations which we considered necessary in order to provide us with sufficient evidence to give reasonable assurance that the financial statements are free from material misstatement, whether caused by fraud or other irregularity or error. In forming our opinion we also evaluated the overall adequacy of the presentation of information in the financial statements.

Membership payment has now been established and Council has not needed to provide further financial assistance since 2009.

ANNUAL REPORT 2011

Mr Paul Richardson

In addition to leading the Council, Paul has been working with a selected group of industry leaders to develop and promote the Passport to Safety Scheme which is being developed to cater to all industry sectors.

Mr Mike Osborne

Mike started the year as one of the three speakers at the two risk seminars run by the Council.

Mike spoke about how his company, which dealt with explosives and heavy industry, succeeded in using risk assessments to maintain an effective and safe environment.

Mike has developed a new training course for haulier skills in line with the MPQC operated within the UK which will be offered to the Jersey transport & haulier industry in 2012, using an employee of Ronez Ltd who had received training as an instructor in the UK.

Mr Simon Boarder

Simon has been working throughout the year to put together a JEP pull out supplement on health and safety that will appeal to all readers. Simon led a small sub-Committee which included a marketing executive who was happy to help with input on a voluntary basis. This document will be finalised and delivered in early 2012.

Mrs Sarah Holland

Sarah continued to work with Webreality on the final design of the Passport to Safety Scheme webpage and platform. She also provided amendments to the financial system to allow greater understanding.

Mr Russell Ball

Since joining Council in August 2011, Russell has worked to provide a breakfast seminar on water hygiene followed by two days of training on Legionella control. This seminar and training is planned for mid 2012.

MFDIA

The Jersey Safety Council made a decision not to respond to any bad media coverage on health and safety to avoid expressing personal preferences and becoming embroiled in no core activities or entering into unnecessary public debate.

KEY OBJECTIVES

One of the key objectives of Council is to develop the existing Passport to Safety scheme from a construction based general awareness test to an all sector test encompassing all employers and employees in the Island.

To undertake this Council members have met with industry leaders from all sectors to table the proposal for this scheme. These meetings were undertaken in September and were accepted as beneficial in principle by all those present.

The key industry sectors have been asked to contribute applicable question and answers for inclusion within the tests.

ADVERTISING AND PROMOTION

JEP Supplement

The Council has continued on its project to produce a factual, informative and professional supplement to be produced and distributed by the Jersey Evening Post. This has taken longer than expected due to the requirement to make the supplement interesting to as many people as possible. It has been decided that the supplement would be directly referenced to health and safety at work but linking in with safety in the home to widen the readership potential.

The supplement is to be part financed through advertising and many of those contacted for this initiative have expressed a willingness to place advertisements.

We come to the end of 2011 with a draft document in place with the intention of seeing it launched late January/early February 2012.

If the feedback is positive the Council may deliver similar supplements in the future.

Other Paper Media

Council continued to distribute various posters created and printed in 2011 which were developed in three languages..

A new electricity risk poster is being developed using artwork from the HSE UK poster design.

The Council's free Health & Safety DVD library had received a strong response initially but this has reduced through the year. Council will be using the JEP pull out supplement to make more people aware of this facility in 2012.

WEBSITE

The website continues to be updated on a regular basis. Retaining control over the content management of the website has allowed the flexibility to manage additions subject matter at short notice when required.

Website data taken from Google analytical has shown that during 2011, 22,797 pages were viewed compared to 15,723 in 2010. Average visits per day went up from 10.75 in 2010 to 17.81 in 2011. We have the ability to interrogate each website visit which has allowed us to focus on relevant topics when required.

In 2011 the Law, Policy and the Passport to Safety sections received doubled the number of website page visits from the previous year, being our most viewed topics and pages.

OVERSEAS PROJECT

Tony Allchurch continued to provide talks with overseas aid on health & safety awareness on a regular basis throughout 2011. Tony retired from Council in 2009 but expressed willingness to undertake talks due to his own work and interest in both overseas aid and health and safety.

FINANCE

OTHER MATTERS

OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH IN CONSTRUCTION SUBCOMITTEE

Whilst the sub group has not met since the release of posters in 2010 we remain committed to developing improved means of highlighting the long-term risk to key elements of occupational health issues.

ECO-ACTIVE

Council remains committed to the environmental principles of the Eco-Active scheme and remains a member of this scheme.

GRANTS

A grant was given to a skin cancer awareness campaign organised and aired through Channel 103.

JOSHA

JOSHA's 2011 AGM financial report remained buoyant and did not require any form of grant from Council in 2011.

TRAINING

The Council's Safety Training Needs Analysis course saw only one training course during 2011 and plans are underway to raise awareness to this course throughout 2012.

A three day manual handling 'train the trainer' course was delivered in the latter half of the year following requests. Mark Embrey, our UK trainer, was able to return to the Island to provide this successful course.

We were contacted by Radiodetection Ltd, who were providing training in the Island, who offered their assistance allowing the Council to offer the CAT/Genny course (Cable Avoidance Tool) to local businesses.

SEMINARS

Risk

With the amendment to the Health & Safety (Jersey) Law 1989 in connection to Risk Assessment, the Council felt it appropriate to provide employers and employees with a greater understanding of what this entailed.

We sourced 3 speakers to deliver the subject from 3 points of view.

Colin Myers, Director of Health and Safety, explained why the law was amended and the implications of the change.

Mike Osborne, Managing Director of Ronez Ltd, spoke of how his company, which covered many high risk operative, managed risk in a positive way.

Ian Touzel, the Managing Director of Islands Insurance, explained how important good risk assessment was when something went wrong and the consequences to the company if this had been overlooked.

The breakfast was successfully delivered to an audience of over 100 people and the PowerPoint presentations have been added to the Council website to allow those unable to attend the opportunity to view this important message.

Woodworking

With the launch of the Woodwork ACoP in July of 2011, Council worked with the Health and Safety Inspectorate to provide two training sessions offering guidance and additional information at Highlands in October.

Jon Gibson and Mark Stevens of Didac Ltd delivered the training and demonstrations.

LEAVING

Mike Baudains retired in June of 2011. The Council is grateful to him for his help and support to health and safety improvements during his 8 years on Council.
