- (ii) The number of marriages performed in the Office of the Superintendent Registrar in 1999 was 585. This is 69.5 per cent of the total number of marriages registered during 1999.
- (iii) The most popular months for marriages in 1999 were August (123) and September (125).
- (iv) During the year 344 couples came to the Island to get married. The most popular months were June (52), May (49) and August (49).
