Report

On 10th January 2001, the Health and Social Services Committee made an Act delegating certain of its functions under the Children (Jersey) Law 1969, as amended.

The terms of the delegation were recorded in an Act of the Committee as follows -

“A4. The Committee, in pursuance of Article 36A of the States of Jersey Law 1966, as amended, received and noted the attached formal statement (designated Committee Paper CP/HSSC/02/01) which detailed certain powers delegated to the President by the Committee.

The Committee accordingly approved the contents of the aforementioned statement and requested that it be presented to the States for information at the earliest available opportunity. The Greffier of the States was requested to take the necessary action.”.

COMMITTEE PAPER

Legislation: Children (Jersey) Law 1969, as amended, Article 85 (2)(c).

Delegate: President of the Health and Social Services Committee.

Functions delegated: To make an application to the Royal Court for the discharge of a Parental Rights Order.

Legislation: Children (Jersey) Law 1969, as amended, Article 30 (9).

Delegate: President of the Health and Social Services Committee.

Functions delegated: To make an application through the Attorney General to the Royal Court for revocation of a Fit Person Order.

Legislation: Children (Jersey) Law 1969, as amended, Article 32 (1).

Delegate: President of the Health and Social Services Committee.

Functions delegated: To allow a child who is the subject of a Fit Person Order to be under the charge and control of a parent, guardian, relative or friend of the child.

Legislation: Children (Jersey) Law 1969, as amended, Article 32 (2).

Delegate: President of the Health and Social Services Committee.

Functions delegated: To make an application to the Royal Court to revoke a Fit Person Order no longer deemed necessary.
