REPORT

Background

- 1. Following changes, as from 1st January 1997, to the Public Finances (Administration) (Jersey) Law 1967, Article 18 allows the Finance and Economics Committee to allocate funds from the General Reserve "where a Committee of the States' authorised revenue expenditure or any credit for capital expenditure is found to be insufficient to meet the demands made on it, or where a contingency has arisen or will arise which could not reasonably have been foreseen at the time of the submission of estimates under Article 15 of this Law."
- 2. The purpose of this report is to notify the States, in accordance with Article 18(6) of the Law, of any decisions made in respect of the granting of funds from the General Reserve for the six-month period 1st January 2002 to 30th June 2002.

Granting of funds

- 3. Appendix A (attached) provides a summary of the funds which have been granted from the Reserve during the first six months of 2002.
- 4. The balance on the Reserve at the beginning of 2002 was approximately £25.2 million made up of the unallocated balance brought forward from 2001 of £11.2 million and the 2002 Budget allocation of £14 million
- 5. During the six-month period to 30th June 2002 the Committee agreed to grant funds of approximately £11 millior from the General Reserve, leaving an unallocated balance of £14.2 million Details of the requests are shown in Appendix A.
- 6. It should be noted that although Appendix A indicates an unallocated balance of £14.2 million in the Reserve. This is mainly due to the timing of requests, which the Committee acknowledges may require additional funding, but for which final requests have yet to be quantified. Once these items have been taken into account the balance of the Reserve is very much reduced.
- 7. All of the requests granted in the six-month period to 30th June 2002 have been subject to rigorous scrutiny by the Finance and Economics Committee.

Cash limits

8. It is hoped that from 2003 onwards, following the prioritisation process, Committees will need to have less recourse to the General Reserve, and that total requests will fall to match the lower allocation made to the General Reserve.

Alternative funding

- 9. Committee Presidents and States members should continue to be reminded of the following alternatives which must be considered prior to the submission of requests for funding from the Reserve -
 - existing services and funds should be examined and re-prioritised;
 - the generation of increased and new sources of income should be considered;
 - the vote transfer facility should be utilised.

Level of the Reserve

- 10. The Committee intends to sustain the current high level of financial discipline in 2003, to this effect the annual allocation to the General Reserve in respect of urgent and unforeseen items has been restricted to approximately £8 million.
- 11. It is proposed that in 2003 an earmarked contingency of approximately £19.6 million will be transferred to the Reserve to fund all in year pay and pension issues. Members are reminded that in previous years significant proportions of pay increments were included in the voted cash limits.

12. The Committee will continue to review all proposals, both revenue and capital, but the expectation is that the General Reserve should only provide for major unforeseen expenditure of an urgent nature. The Committee is determined that the General Reserve will not be used to circumvent the budget process within which priorities for revenue and capital expenditure are determined.

Transfer of funds

13. In addition, the Committee must also advise the States of any transfer of funds between individual Committee's authorised revenue and capital votes in accordance with Article 18B(3) of the Law. Accordingly, details of transfers are shown on Appendices B, C and D and are presented to the States for information.
