Report

On 24th October 2002, the Home Affairs Committee made an Act delegating certain of its functions under the Fire Precautions (Jersey) Law 1977, as amended.

The terms of the delegation were recorded in an Act of the Committee as follows -

“A2. The Committee, in accordance with Article 36(A) of the States of Jersey Law 1966, as amended, decided to delegate to the Chief Fire Officer or his Deputy, with effect from 1st January 2003, its functions in accordance with Article 9 of the Fire Precautions (Jersey) Law 1977, as amended, as follows -

Legislation:	Fire Precautions (Jersey) Law 1977
Delegate:	The Chief Fire Officer or, in his absence, the Deputy Chief Fire Officer
Function delegated:	Where the Chief Fire Officer or his Deputy is satisfied that the risk to persons in case of fire is so serious that, until steps have been taken to reduce the risk to a reasonable level, the use of the premises be prohibited or restricted.
Scope of delegation:	Notification of any prohibitions or restrictions to be advised to the Home Affairs Committee as soon as possible.

The Greffier of the States was requested to make the necessary arrangements for this Act to be presented to the States as a Rapport et Correspondance.”.
