The Home Affairs Committee has the honour to present the following statistics for the year 2002.

1. Statement as to the number of births, deaths and marriages registered in the twelve parishes of the Island during the year 2002.

- Notes: (i) When the various re-registrations are deducted from the official birth registrations shown above, the actual number of children born in the Island in 2002 was 930. This is 31 less than last year and continues the downward trend in the birth rate since 1994.
 - (ii) The number of marriages performed in the Office of the Superintendent Registrar in 2001 was 402. This was 17 fewer than in 2001. A further 25 civil marriages was held in Approved Premises under the Marriage and Civil Status (Jersey) Law 2001 which came into force on 1st May 2002. The most popular months for marriages were August (122) and September (101).
 - (iii) During the year 190 couples came to the Island to be married. This is 15 fewer than last year. The most popular months were August (46) followed by July and September each with 27 visiting couples.
