STATES OF JERSEY LAW 2005: DELEGATION OF FUNCTIONS – HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES – MEDICINES

REPORT

On 12th July 2007, the Minister for Health and Social Services made a decision delegating certain of his functions under Article 28 of the States of Jersey Law 2005 in respect of the Medicines (Health Professionals– Exemption) (Jersey) Order 2001.

The terms of the delegation were recorded in a ministerial decision as follows -

Legislation:	Medicines (Health Professionals – Exemption) (Jersey) Order 2001.
Delegate:	Chair of Health and Social Services Governance Board.
Functions delegated:	Article $1(2)$ – to give a direction that a relevant health professional authorised by the department to do so may sell, supply or administer a medicinal product other than in accordance with Articles 51, 52 and 57(2) of the Medicines (Jersey) Law 1995.
Scope of delegation:	A direction may only be given in respect of a relevant health professional employed by the Health and Social Services Department. The details of any direction must be approved by the Health and Social Services Medicines Governance Committee.
