STATES OF JERSEY LAW 2005: DELEGATION OF FUNCTIONS – HEALTH AND SOCIAL SERVICES – PHARMACIES

**Presented to the States on 18th July 2007
by the Minister for Health and Social Services**

REPORT

On 12th July 2007, the Minister for Health and Social Services made a decision delegating certain of his functions under Article 28 of the States of Jersey Law 2005 in respect of the Misuse of Drugs (Jersey) Law 1978.

The terms of the delegation were recorded in a ministerial decision as follows –

Legislation:	Misuse of Drugs (Jersey) Law 1978
Delegate:	Chief Pharmacist or nominated deputy.
Function delegated:	Article 4(2)(b) – to issue a general licence to permit the importation or exportation of controlled drugs, as specified in the Second Schedule to the Law. The delegate may attach any conditions he deems appropriate.
Scope of delegation:	Licences are to be issued only to registered pharmacies and the hospital pharmacy department. Licences may be issued as renewals or to registered pharmacies which have not previously been licensed for this purpose. The delegate may <u>not</u> refuse or revoke a licence, which should be considered by the Minister. The duration of any licence shall not exceed a period of 3 years. The delegate may not issue a licence to himself.
