Question

“Further to [Written Question 310/2025](#) regarding waste management and recycling at public events, will the Minister advise whether he has discussed this matter with the Bailiff’s Public Entertainment Panel and, if so, whether the Panel is willing to take a direct approach to recycling requirements for future public events?”

Answer

The Unlawful Public Entertainments (Jersey) Regulations 2024 allow the Bailiff to grant permission for the provision of a public entertainment subject to the conditions the Bailiff thinks fit. I have not discussed this matter further, but would be willing to initiate discussions with ministerial colleagues, and the Bailiff, to determine if further legislative powers are needed in respect of waste management and recycling.

As set out in the previous response to WQ 310/2025, the Minister for Infrastructure has limited powers, which apply specifically to events held on main roads. In these cases, the Minister may impose conditions related to public safety and event logistics, but not waste management plans.

Notwithstanding the above, there are ongoing campaigns through eco active to encourage and advise businesses on waste reduction, reuse, and recycling, and the associated benefits. These are aimed at, and would apply equally to, one off event organisers, mobile caterers etc as static businesses.
