## Environment, Housing, and Infrastructure Panel Draft Residential Tenancy (Jersey) Amendment Law 202- Review

The Environment, Housing and Infrastructure Panel acknowledges the importance of the amended Draft Residential Tenancy (Jersey) Amendment Law 202- and appreciates the engagement and co-operation demonstrated by you and your department throughout the scrutiny process to date.

The Panel has already received a significant volume of submissions from a wide range of stakeholders in response to its consultation on the proposed legislation. This high level of engagement reflects the strong public interest in the matter and the importance of ensuring that the amendment is subject to a thorough and rigorous examination.

In light of this, the Panel also intends to engage an expert advisor to provide specialist advice to its review. To allow for the considered incorporation of this analysis—alongside a comprehensive review of stakeholder evidence—the Panel formally requests that the debate of the amended Draft Residential Tenancy (Jersey) Amendment Law 202- be deferred to the next sitting of the States Assembly on 9th September 2025.
